during a natural disaster. Disaster management plans are multi-layered and are aimed to address such issues as floods, hurricanes, fires and even mass failure of utilities or the rapid spread of disease. India has been traditionally vulnerable to the natural disasters on the account of its unique geo-climatic conditions. Flood, droughts, cyclones, earthquakes and landslides would have been recurrent phenomena. About 59% of the landmass is prone to earthquakes of various intensities. Over 40 million hectares is prone to floods about 8% of the total area is prone to cyclones and 69% of the area is susceptible to drought.

With this consideration aiming awareness of students for safety measures and operations, Rajmata Jijau Shikshan Prasark Mandal's Arts, Commerce, and Science College, Bhosari, Pune-39 conducted two days workshop on disaster management.

Fire the major factor of disaster is pointed as a key element of workshop. The workshop was conducted on 16<sup>th</sup> Feb. and 18<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2019 in the college campus.
